Row 3: Chain 2 (this does not count as a stitch), work 1 double crochet (dc) in the first stitch. Work 1 front post treble crochet (fptr) in the corresponding double crochet two rows below, then work 1 double crochet in the next stitch. Repeat this pattern across to the end of the row, then turn.





Row 4: Repeat Row 2.

Row 5: Chain 2, work 1 front post treble crochet (fptr) in the first double crochet two rows below. Work 1 double crochet in the next stitch, then work 1 front post treble crochet in the corresponding double crochet two rows below. Repeat this pattern across to the end of the row, then turn.





Row 6: Repeat Row 2. To continue the pattern, repeat Rows 3 to 6, and conclude with a repeat of Row 2.




Alpine Stitch Diagram:
