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### **Catherine's Wheel Crochet Stitch**


The Catherine's Wheel Crochet Stitch, characterized by its exquisite beauty and elegance, produces a solid and reversible crochet fabric adorned with a delightful texture. Surprisingly, mastering this stitch is quite straightforward, involving basic techniques such as chains, single crochet, and double crochet.

The intricate wheel-like pattern emerges when you crochet 7 double crochet stitches into the same stitch to form one half of the wheel. Subsequently, on the next row, crocheting 7 double crochet together creates the other half of the wheel.

When it comes to crafting a blanket, the Catherine's Wheel Crochet stitch shines brilliantly. Its softness and distinct texture make it an ideal choice. What's more, the stitch allows for swift progress due to its predominant use of double crochet stitches.

To create a Catherine's Wheel Stitch Crochet Blanket, start with a chain that comprises a multiple of 10 stitches, then add 6 stitches and an extra stitch for the initial chain. This ensures a harmonious and visually appealing outcome for your crochet masterpiece.

### Abbreviations

st – stitch ch – chain sc – single crochet dc – double crochet


### Tutorial

*Row 1:* Begin with a single crochet (sc) in the second chain from the hook, followed by another sc in the next chain. \*Skip the next 3 chains, then work 7 double crochets (dc) in the following chain. Skip another 3 chains and make 1 sc in the next 3 chains. Repeat this pattern from \* until you reach the last 4 chains. Skip 3 chains, work 4 dc in the last chain, then turn your work.

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*Row 2:* Chain 1 and make 1 sc in the next 2 dc. \*Chain 3, then work 7 dc together over the next 7 stitches. Chain 3 again, and make 1 sc in the next 3 stitches. Repeat this pattern from \* until you reach the last 4 chains. Chain 3, work 4 dc together over the last 4 stitches, then turn.



*Row 3:* Chain 3, then work 3 dc in the first stitch (which is the top of the 4 dc cluster). \*Skip the chain-3 space, make 1 sc in the next 3 stitches, skip the next chain-3 space, and work 7 dc into the top of the 7 dc cluster. Repeat this pattern until you reach the last chain-3 space. Skip the chain-3 space, make 1 sc in the next 2 stitches, then turn.

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*Row 4:* Chain 3 (this counts as the first stitch), then work 3 dc together over the next 3 stitches (skip the first stitch). \*Chain 3, make 1 sc in the next 3 stitches, chain 3, and work 7 dc together over the next 7 stitches. Repeat this pattern until you reach the last 2 stitches. Chain 3, make 1 sc in the next 2 stitches, then turn.



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*Row 5:* Chain 1, make 1 sc in the next 2 stitches. \*Skip the chain-3 space, work 7 dc into the top of the 7 dc cluster, skip the chain-3 space, and make 1 sc in the next 3 stitches. Repeat this pattern until you reach the last chain-3 space. Work 4 dc in the beginning chain-3 of the previous row.



Repeat rows 2 to 5 to continue the pattern.
