Materials Needed:

Tutorial:

Round 1: Begin by chaining an even number of stitches.



Round 2: Now, let's move on to the first row. For row 1, single crochet in the second stitch from



the hook, single crochet in the next stitch, *chain 1, skip a stitch, single crochet in the next stitch. Repeat this pattern across until the last stitch. Single crochet in the final stitch and then turn.



Round 3: Moving on to row 2, where the clusters come to life. Chain 4, work into the first chain space as if making a double crochet, but only pull through the first two loops on the hook. Repeat this process, essentially creating a partial double crochet, until there are 5 loops on the hook. Yarn over and pull through all 5 loops, chain 1. Continue this pattern, forming a cluster in each chain space across the row. When you reach the last two stitches of the row, chain 1, and double crochet into the last stitch.



Round 4: Repeat these two rows for as long as you desire. That's all there is to it! Enjoy the rhythmic beauty of your Cluster Stitch crochet pattern as your creation unfolds.
