

How to Crochet a Classic Granny Square

Materials Needed:

Yarn: Choose your favorite yarn color(s) and weight. The granny square is versatile, allowing you to experiment with various color combinations.

Crochet Hook: Select a crochet hook that complements your chosen yarn. A medium-sized hook (such as an H or I hook) is a good starting point.

Scissors: A pair of sharp scissors is essential for cutting the yarn.

Yarn Needle: You'll need a yarn needle for weaving in loose ends.

Stitches:

SS - Slip Stitch

CH - Chain

DC - Double Crochet

Pattern:

Commence with yarn color "A" by creating a magic circle or CH 3 and SS into the second chain from your hook to form a circle.

Round 1:

CH 2 and place 1 DC into the circle. (Complete this cluster later with your last DC of the round)

CH 2 (first corner space)

Make 3 DC stitches into the circle.

CH 2 (second corner space)

Make 3 DC stitches into the circle.

CH 2 (third corner space)

Make 3 DC stitches into the circle.

CH 2 (fourth corner space)

Make 1 DC into the circle. SS into the top of your beginning CH 2 (Last DC completes the first cluster). Fasten off and change your yarn colors.





Round 2:

Attach yarn color "B" into any ch 2 corner space with a SS.

In that corner space, CH 2 and then create 1 DC (Complete this cluster later with your last DC of the round). Continue in that space by making CH 2 and 3 DC stitches.

CH₁

In the second corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH 1

In the third corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH 1



In the fourth corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH₁

Make 1 DC into the very first chain space you started and SS into the top of your beginning CH 2. (Last DC completes the first cluster). Fasten off and change yarn colors.



Round 3:

Attach your next yarn color "C" with a SS into any CH 1 space.

In that CH 1 space: CH 2 and then create 1 DC (Complete this cluster later with your last DC of the round)

CH₁

In the first corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH 1

In the CH 1 space from the previous round (make 3 DC)

CH 1

In the second corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

Ch 1

In the ch 1 space from the previous round (make 3 DC)

CH 1

In the third corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH 1

In the CH 1 space from the previous round (make 3 DC)


CH₁

In the fourth corner space (make 3 DC, CH 2, 3 DC)

CH 1

Make 1 DC into the next CH 1 space from the previous round and slip stitch into the top of your beginning CH 2 (Last DC completes the first cluster). Fasten off and weave in all ends. Your 3 round granny square is complete!
